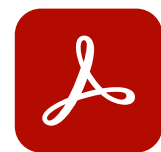

Advantages	Fast sharing without leaving InDesign and live, in-document comment/markup updates; no PDF creation required for review process	PDFs from any source (InDesign, Word, etc.) can be shared without reviewers needing Acrobat or any other Adobe software	Faster, less cumbersome than opening/reviewing multiple PDFs in Acrobat; Replace Text comments automatically applied in InDesign file without copy/paste or re-keying.	Full assignment-based editorial workflow support between writers, copy editors, and designers
Best for	Direct, time-sensitive collaboration between a designer in InDesign and a reviewer who may not have any Adobe software entitlements	Broad distribution to multiple stakeholders for review where Adobe entitlements are not a certainty and reviewers can benefit from seeing all other comments in one place.	Accurately and efficiently incorporating PDF edits and comments from multiple reviewers who may be using Acrobat Pro, Reader or Document Cloud Share for Review.	Distributed co-editing (e.g., editorial workflows) where writers can view/modify text in context without impacting layout or locking designers out of the InDesign file.
