Setting up XD artboards for user feedback For our quiz, we'll need to provide the user with a question and range of answers. Then, we'll


need to provide feedback for both correctly and incorrectly answered questions. And finally, we'll need to consider providing feedback for their overall progress as well as a way to gauge

their success rate.

When designing your project, it is important to keep in mind the steps a user needs to take in

order to complete a task. We also need to design the feedback a user will encounter during

the project. This is the exact type of work for which XD was created to help you produce.






